Day-of event check in begins at 6:00 PM and Ride begins at 6:30 PM
The Ride of Silence is a free ride that asks its cyclists to ride no faster than 12 mph, wear helmets, follow the rules of the road and remain silent during the ride. There are no registration fees. The ride, which is held internationally during National Bike Month, aims to raise the awareness of motorists, police and city officials that cyclists have a legal right to the public roadways. The ride is also a chance to show respect for and honor the lives of those who have been killed or injured.

Obituary for Tom Wilsted

Thomas P. Wilsted, 80, of Green Valley, AZ passed away on April 6, 2024. Tom had three great loves in his life: family, history and cycling. He is survived by his wife Mary, son Jeff, daughter-in-law Deanne, granddaughter Faith, sister Nancy and nephew Noel.

Tom was born on April 16, 1943, in Detroit, MI. He grew up in Michigan, attending Kalamazoo College, where he met his soul-mate and partner of 57 years, Mary. His love of history led him to a graduate degree from the University of Wisconsin and into his career as an archivist. He was fortunate to apply this talent of organizing and keeping history for organizations including: the Turnbull Library in Wellington, New Zealand; the National Salvation Army Archives in Manhattan; the American Heritage Center at the University of Wyoming (Associate Director); and the Thomas J. Dodd Research Center at the University of Connecticut (Director). It was in this last role that he concluded his professional career, retiring in 2008.

While maintaining the history of others was important to Tom, making his own history with his family was his greatest joy. Tom, Mary and their young son, Jeff, moved to New Zealand early in his career. He traveled all over the beautiful island nation and even decided, later in life, that he wanted his ashes scattered near Kapiti Island in NZ. While it was the work that brought him there, it was the lifelong friends he made, as well as the memories of his travels, that remained with Tom throughout the rest of his life. Similarly, whether as part of his church in Westfield NJ, Coventry CT or Green Valley AZ, Tom enjoyed both socializing and serving his community. He also loved bonding with friends and family while cheering on his UConn Husky basketball teams.

It was after retiring and moving to Green Valley that Tom re-discovered his passion for cycling and found a wonderful community that welcomed him. He would ride almost every day, no matter the weather, and could proudly claim to cycle his age in miles on every birthday up until recently. He will be remembered as someone who always gave to others selflessly and humbly... whether writing newsletters for the Posada Peddlers and GVR Cycling groups, organizing bike drives for local charities, volunteering within La Posada, or helping Mary reach the dishes on the top shelf.

May the bike trails in heaven be long and beautiful. We will miss you.

A service to celebrate Tom's life will be held at The Good Shepherd UCC, 17750 South La Cañada Drive, Sahuarita, AZ 85629, on Saturday, June 8, 2024, at 10:00 am.
